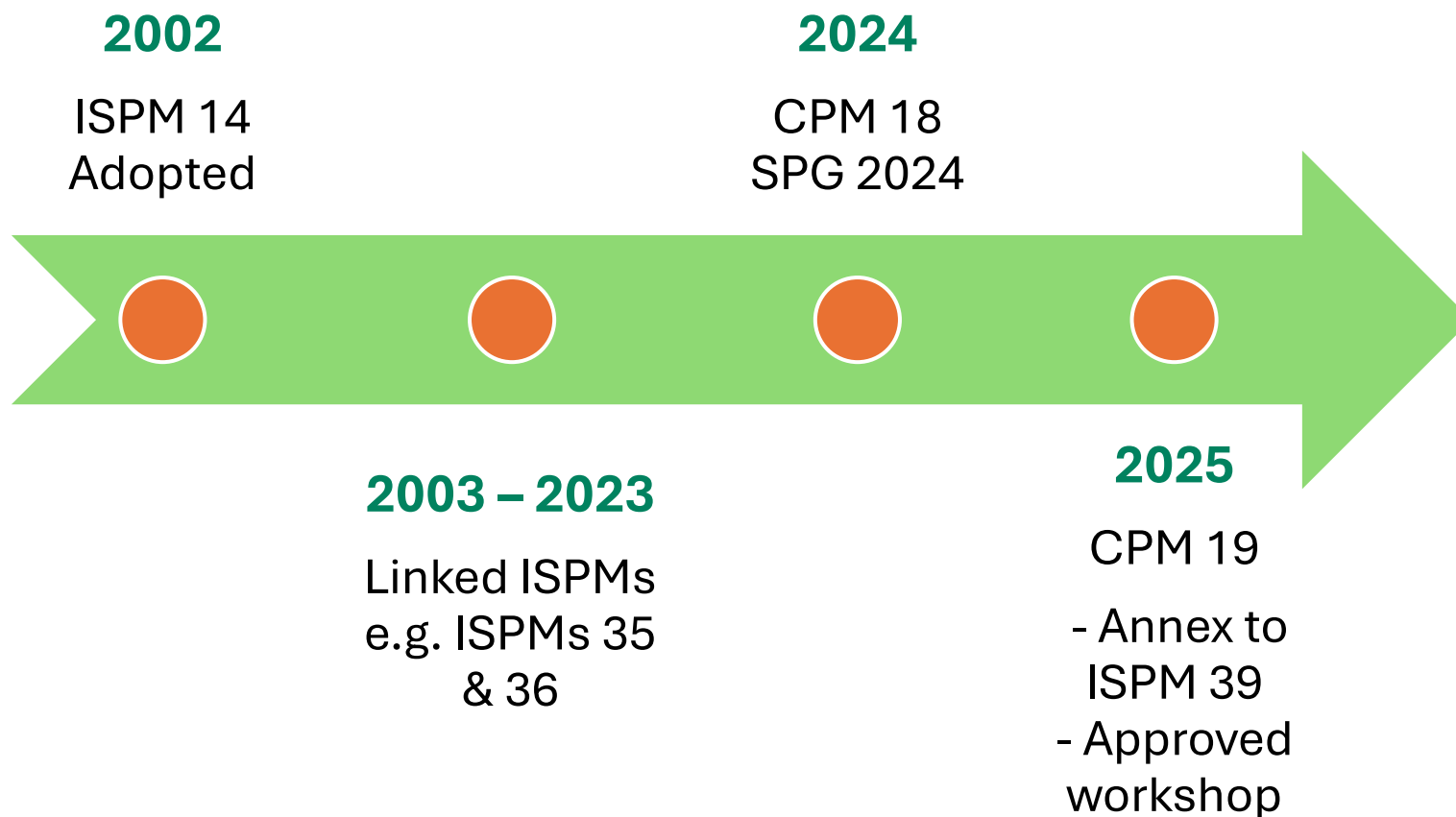

Ambitions

- Identify and understand relevant ISPMs
- Increased awareness of existing tools used to develop and assess systems approaches
- Identify revisions to modernise and improve ISPM14
- Identify gaps in available guidance material and capacity development activities
- Increased global engagement and collaboration



Outcomes

- Improved collective understanding of the concept and use of systems approaches
- Revised ISPM 14 ready for adoption by 2030
- Increased use of systems approaches facilitating safe international trade
